Ahmed: Wheat is better, and it's very suitable for our land this year.

Ali: Corn is better, corn is better!

Devil: Don't listen. Your choice is the best.

Ali: My choice is the best. Corn is better. Corn is better.

Mum: Calm down, calm down my son. Let's sow wheat.

Devil: See! She loves him more than you.

Ali: You love him more than me.

Mom: Oh, my son! You're both my dearest sons. I love you

both. [Ali laughs sarcastically]

Devil: Divide the land

Ali: Let's divide the land.

Ahmed: Oh no!

Mother: Division?! Division?! No! That's impossible! Division?

No! No! [A fence appears]

Scene 3

Ali: I'm very tired, I'm very tired little crops. Oh, my God!

Devil: Everything will be ok, work alone.

Ali: It's better to be away from them.

Ahmed: I'm very tired. I'm very tired, little crops. I wish I could work with my brother again. I wish I could get rid of this crazy fence. Oh, my God! Help us! Help us for our mother's sake!

Devil: You always think of your brother but he doesn't think of you at all. His part is bigger than yours. You can't even take your rights. Weak boy!

Ahmed: No, I'm not weak. I can do it. [Ahmed goes to his brother's part.]

Ahmed: Hey! Hey, your part is bigger than mine.

Ali: What?!

Ahmed: The two parts should be equal. I should take from your part and add it to mine.

Ali: Are you dreaming?! Stop it!

Ahmed: No, I won't!

[Mum collapses]

Mother: Are you together again?

Ali and Ahmed: Yes, yes. We're together.

Mother: Thank God. [They get rid of the fence]
